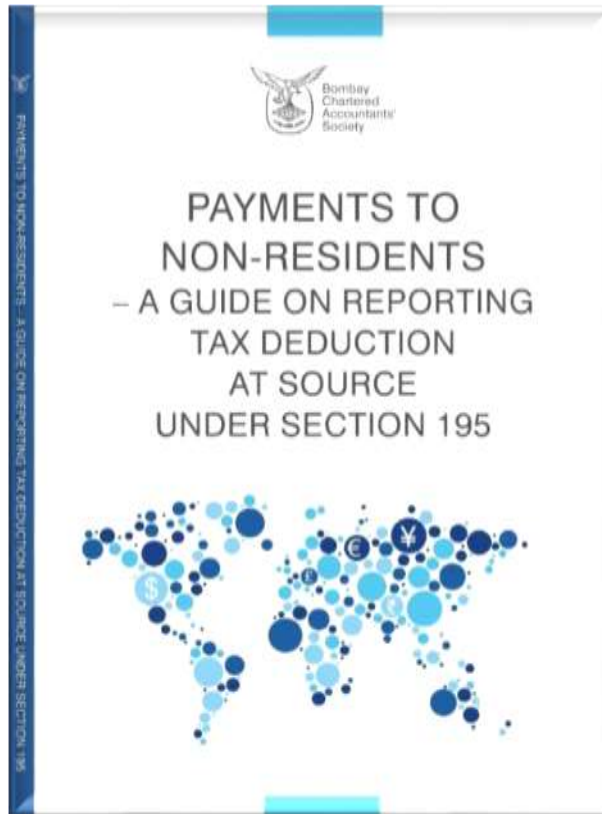

<b>Title:</b>	<b>PAYMENTS TO NON-RESIDENTS – A Guide On Reporting Tax Deduction At Source Under Section 195</b>
<b>Features:</b>	<p>Deduction of tax at source from non-residents has always been a complex subject since the payer effectively needs to determine the tax liability in India of the payee.</p> <p>The changes brought from time-to-time, and recently in 2016, including the requirement of e-filing, have added to the complexities of the procedures.
